- 5. Practice responding to others with a cheerful voice.



Step 3

Read the Lesson Aim.

Lesson Aim

This lesson is to give the student an understanding of what the voice is and what God's purpose for it is. Even if a person could speak "with the tongues of men and of angels," it would be of no value without **love**.

Help the student to relate this to the character quality of **love** that God manifested in giving His Son to us. Learn how, by the correct use of your voice, God can manifest His **love** to the world.

God is **love**, and it is His nature to give. He gave Jesus to reveal His **love** both to men and to angels. Jesus is the outshining of God's character. Jesus is God's thoughts made audible.

"...So Christ set up His tabernacle in the midst of our human encampment. He pitched His tent by the side of the tents of men, that He might dwell among us, and make us familiar with His divine character and life. 'The word became flesh, and tabernacled among us and we beheld his glory, glory as of the Only

Begotten of the father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14)."*

The Word of God is what gives light and life to the fallen world. The voice is the means God gave to man to express God's word and **love** to a fallen world.

We can participate with God by letting Him use us to make His thoughts audible through our voice. We can express our **love** to Him and to others by speaking and singing God's word correctly.

The human voice exceeds every musical instrument. "Vocal music is one of God's gifts to men, an instrument that cannot be surpassed or equaled when God's **love** abounds in the soul."**

Steps in Bible Study

- 1. Prayer
- 2. Read the verses/meditate/memorize.
- 3. Look up key words in *Strong's* Concordance and find their mean-

ing in the Hebrew or Greek dictionary in the back of that book.

- 4. Cross reference (marginal reference) with other Bible texts. An excellent study tool is *The Treasury of Scripture Knowledge*.
- 5. Use Bible custom books for more information on the times.
- 6. Write a summary of what you have learned from those verses.
- 7. Mark key thoughts in the margin of your Bible.
- 8. Share your study with others to reinforce the lessons you have learned.



Vocal Fact Sheet

What is the voice? The voice is a <u>distinguishable</u> feature of someone or something. It is an expression of the giver, the means of transfer of thought. There are no two voices alike. The voice is a means of <u>identification</u>. Why, even the birds have a unique voice all their own. Every robin has a different voice from every other robin.

Because our voices are uniquely different, no one can express God's thoughts the way we can.

God has given us a talent called the voice. It is our duty to Him to cultivate that talent that we may give sounds and words of **praise** to others, and draw them to God.

As we cultivate our voice and speaking mannerisms, while maintaining a living connection with God, our voices and characters will become refined.

Refine – To improve in accuracy, delicacy, or anything that constitutes excellence. To become pure.

As we improve our voices, they will become melodious. Our voices, even as we speak, should have a musical quality about them. The voice should be pleasing to the ear.

As we express God's **love** through our voices, our manner should be the same as Jesus would have had.

God's thoughts are the thinking of His mind. Jesus' purpose for coming to this earth was to reveal God both to men and to angels, to make God's thoughts audible to men. It is to be our purpose also, to reveal God's thoughts through our voices.

As we improve our voices, they will become melodious.

As we express God's **love** through our voices, our manner should be the same as Jesus would have had.

An Incident

When I was a child, I sought, and I believed found, the dear Saviour. I was very happy, and wanted all my playmates to become Christians. But, alas! I did not always do right; and I fear that I sometimes stood in their way.

One day I asked my cousin if she would seek Jesus. She wanted to be good, but thought Christians were not all as good as they should be, and that there was not much difference between a Christian and one who was not. Said she, "Don't be angry with me, but I want to tell you that I have sometimes heard you speak unkindly to your sister."

She had, then, been watching me very closely; and my unguarded words had led her to distrust me as a Christian. I could not lead her to Christ. She grew up a proud woman. Since then, when I have heard children who profess religion use unkind words to playmates, brothers, sisters, or parents, I have thought of that incident in my boyhood days, and wondered if the result would be equally sad.

Remember, children, that if you are trying to be Christians, you will be watched very closely, to see if you err by word, act, or look. And, if you do wrong, they may not tell you of it, as my cousin did me, but, perhaps, will say to others, "I don't believe he is as good as he pretends to be, after all, or he would not be so ill-natured to his parents and play mates. If he is a Christian, I don't want to be one." Children, be careful of your words that they are always **loving**.




