1. **When did the Feast of Unleavened Bread begin and end?** (Fifteenth day of the month Abib, or Nisan, and continued seven days)
2. **Explain the Feast of Unleavened Bread and how it related to the Passover.** (Page 103)
3. **Fill in the following blanks: “The whole Jewish economy is a compacted prophecy of the gospel.”**
4. **What special significance was attached to the day following the Passover.** (It was kept as a sabbath)
5. **In the year our Saviour was crucified, on what day did the Passover fall? (Friday) What did John call the Sabbath after Passover that year? (A high day)**
6. **Define what a high sabbath is.** (It was a term used whenever the ceremonial annual sabbath came upon the weekly Sabbath of the Lord)
7. **What greater work did God do than to speak this world into existence?** (Re-create man)
8. **Explain what Christ was saying when He said, “*It is finished.*”** (He was announcing the fact that He had complied with the requirements of the law, had lived a sinless life, and was to shed His blood as a ransom for the world)
9. **How was nature affected by the cry, “*It is finished*”?** (Page 105)
10. **How was the Sabbath doubly blessed after the Saviour died?** (Memorial of redemption as well as of creation)
11. **Draw a picture of a bridge using page 106, and label it as described.**
12. **How long will the Sabbath continue to be kept?** (Forever)

13. **What took place on the second day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread?** (Offering of first-fruits)
14. **What did the people do during the seven days following the Passover?** (People ate unleavened bread)
15. **What does the number seven symbolize?** (See the book *Number in Scripture* – perfect)
16. **What is leaven a type of?** (Malice and wickedness)
17. **What does unleavened bread represent?** (Sincerity and truth)
18. **What do the seven days of the Feast of Unleavened Bread symbolize?** (He whose past sins are hidden, and who realizes what it is to have the condemnation of the old life taken away, enters into a new life. He should not return to his life of sin, but live in all “sincerity and truth”)
19. **Write out your memory verses.**
