- 1. Where did the burnt offering have its origin?**  
(Gate of the garden of Eden)
- 2. Where did the typical service of the burnt offering end?**  
(At the cross)
- 3. What did laying the entire sacrifice upon the altar and burning it typify?** (Surrender of sin and a consecration of the entire life to the service of God)
- 4. When God's people journeyed during the patriarchal age, what did they leave behind?** (Altars of stones)
- 5. Why did the Lord have an altar built in the court of the tabernacle?** (Because the people were so prone to idolatry. Explain further)
- 6. What do the stories of the burnt offerings in the Bible tell us?**  
(Wonderful victories of when individuals drew near to God and put their sins away)
- 7. Name some of these stories about burnt offerings.**  
(Abraham on Mount Moriah, Gideon, and so forth)
- 8. Explain the meaning of the whole burnt offering.**  
(Type of full consecration that must come into every life)
- 9. Think about Romans 12:1, as you write it from memory.**
- 10. To offer a sacrifice without surrender of the heart and life was an abomination to the Lord. This is illustrated by Christ in a New Testament story. Can you relate this story and explain.** (Mark 12:41-44)
- 11. Write from memory I Samuel 15:22.**
- 12. Fill in the following blanks: "The whole burnt offering was offered as an atonement for sin."** (Page 134)

13. **Describe the process the sinner went through when offering a burnt offering.** (Page 134:1)
14. **Every morning and evening a lamb was offered at the sanctuary as a whole burnt offering. On Sabbath four lambs were offered. Explain why?** (These sacrifices typified a reconsecration of the whole congregation each morning and evening to the service of God)
15. **Write a paragraph explaining the meaning of the lessons of the type in the burnt offering for us today.** (See page 134:3-4)
