### **Review Questions**

- 1. How was the offering of the red heifer different from all others? (It was an occasional sacrifice, offered when needed, to purify from ceremonial uncleanness those who for any reason had touched the dead)
- 2. Why did the heifer have to be red, without blemish and never been broken to bear the yoke? (Typifying the blood of Christ, and representing Him "who knew no sin." It had always been free and never forced to do anything. He came of His own free will)
- 3. What power drew Christ toward the cross of Calvary? (Supreme heavenly love)
- 4. Describe where the red heifer was taken and by whom? (Page 147:2)
- 5. Who killed the heifer? (Elders) What did the priest do with the blood? (With his face toward the temple, he sprinkled the blood toward the temple seven times)
- 6. Write a paragraph telling about the ceremony when a man was found slain. (Pages 147:4-148)
- 7. Why was the red heifer offered without the camp? (Typifying that Christ suffered not for the Hebrew race alone, but for the whole world)
- 8. Why was the red heifer taken to a rough valley, so rocky and utterly worthless that it had never been plowed? (Representing the fact that Satan has so marred the image of God in man. However, there are none so sunken in sin or in heathen darkness that Christ cannot redeem)
- 9. What did the casting in the fire of the cedar wood, hyssop, and scarlet thread represent? (The purifying of the earth and all vegetation from every trace of sin)

- 10. After the body of the heifer was burned to ashes, what must an uncontaminated person (who had not touched the dead) do? (He gathered the ashes and placed them in a clean place. These were to be kept for purifying those who touched the dead, including objects that had been contaminated by touching the dead—house or tent, and so forth.)
- 11. Why was the ceremony so elaborate and detailed? (To impress the people of the terrible nature of sin)
- 12. Tell why some of the ashes were placed in pure running water, and a ceremonially clean person, dipping a bunch of hyssop and cedar in the ashes and water, then sprinkled the tent, the articles within the tent, and the people. (Page 150:1-2)
- 13. Fill in the blanks: "These typical <u>ceremonies</u>, like a great <u>reflector</u>, throw <u>light</u> upon the <u>ministry</u> of Christ that cannot be obtained in any other portion of the Scriptures." (Page 151)
- 14. Write out your memory verses.
