

## Review Questions

1. **What was the penalty for one who failed to observe the special requirements enjoined during the day of atonement?** (Those who did not comply were cut off from the people of Israel. Page 220)
2. **What does Satan bring to bear upon this last generation?** (All the wisdom he has gained in a six thousand years' warfare. Page 221)
3. **How are God's people in the last days different from that of any other company that has ever lived?** (They will live for a time without a Mediator. Page 221)
4. **Why has God enjoined special duties upon the last generation?** (That they might be more strongly fortified against the attacks of the enemy, and not be overthrown by his devices. Page 221)
5. **What will be the fate of an individual who, during the Antitypical day of atonement, thinks that Christ will plead his case while he himself ignores the work God has enjoined upon the antitypical congregation?** (He will find at last that his name is blotted out from the book of life. Page 221)
6. **What four things were required of each individual member of ancient Israel on the day of atonement?**
  - 1) "The day of atonement...shall be a holy convocation unto you."
  - 2) "Ye shall afflict your souls."
  - 3) "Offer an offering made by fire unto the Lord."
  - 4) "Ye shall do no work in that same day."
7. **What does it mean when it says that it was to be a "holy convocation"?** (The people were to assemble for worship. Page 222)
8. **The requirement to meet with others in a "holy convocation" is a test of what condition?** (It is a spiritual thermometer by which every Christian can test his spiritual condition. Page 222)

9. **What is meant by the individual needing to “afflict” his soul?** (He must search his heart, put away every sin, and spend much time in prayer. Page 222)
10. **What further requirement was also made of the ancient Jews and is still observed by present day Jews?** (The abstinence from food on the day of atonement. Pages 222-223)
11. **What will the individual who realizes that the judgment is going on do?** (He will search his heart and pray earnestly that God will accept him. Page 223)
12. **How can we follow the work of our High Priest in the heavenly sanctuary?** (By the signs in the heavens, in the earth, and among the nations. Page 223)
13. **During the typical day of atonement there was to be complete control of the appetite. Of what was this a type?** (The self-control to be exercised during the antitypical period of the atonement. Pages 223-224)
14. **What does God expect of His people concerning their appetites?** (God designs that His people shall be masters of their appetites and keep under the body. Page 224)
15. **Why is it so important that we have control of our appetites?** (That we may have clearer minds to comprehend divine truths and follow the work of our High Priest in the heavenly sanctuary. Page 224)
16. **What Bible verses from Isaiah describe the condition in the present world?** (*“In that day did the Lord God of hosts call to weeping, and to mourning, and to baldness, and to girding with sackcloth: and behold, joy and gladness, slaying oxen, and killing sheep, eating flesh and drinking wine.”* Isaiah 22:12-13. Page 224)
17. **Luke 21:34-36 tells us that God is concerned about what two aspects of the food that we eat?** (The quality and quantity of the food that we eat. Page 225)

18. **What makes it possible for a Christian to be complete master of his appetite?** (To have Christ dwelling in the heart. Page 226)
19. **What are the three texts which, when taken together, contain a rule for eating honey?** (*“My son eat thou honey, because it is good.”* Proverbs 24:13. *“Hast thou found honey? eat so much as is sufficient for thee.”* Proverbs 25:16. *“It is not good to eat much honey.”* Proverbs 25:27. Page 226)
20. **What do the three above texts teach us about eating food in general?** (Eat nothing but good food and *“only so much as is sufficient.”* Page 226)
21. **How is the offering made in the type different from that made in the anti type during the day of atonement?** (In the type, the offerings were made by fire and consumed upon the altar. In the anti-type God desires that the whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He desires that the entire life of the Christian be laid upon the altar, ready to be used as He directs. Page 227)
22. **What is the requirement to fulfil this?** (We must daily accept Christ as our sin-offering, and know what it is to be *“accepted in the Beloved.”* Page 227)
23. **What did it mean in the type for the day of atonement to be a ceremonial sabbath?** (All work was to be laid aside, and the entire thought was given to seeking God and serving Him. God’s work was given the first thought during the entire day. Page 227)
24. **Does this mean that the Christian should not attend to personal business during the antitype?** (No. He never intended that His people should be *“slothful in business.”* Page 227)
25. **What is God’s requirement?** (God promises to bless His people in temporal things if they fulfil the anti type by looking after His work and service first, and their temporal interests second. Page 227)

**26. What is one of Satan's most successful traps for well-meaning people?** (He persuades them that the daily cares of the household are so important that they have no time to study God's word and pray, until, for lack of spiritual food and communion with God, they become so weak spiritually that they accept the doubts and unbelief the enemy is constantly presenting to them. When the time comes that they think they do have time to study their Bibles, they find they have lost all relish for God's word. Page 228)
