>All the certificates for the 995 new members were delivered and communion taken to several groups. Plan to reach all soon, including the Prison church.

>Two young men were brought to the mission for a couple weeks to study with the Pastor. They did well and were among the 22 new members baptized at the Mission Sabbath the 26th. They have now returned to their own districts as missionaries.

> We managed to send a large selection of Bibles and Books to Nyanga Schoolmaster for the busy outreach library there.

Big Changes !

We shared with you the sad loss of our dear Sister Molly, but not the amazing miracle that resulted in big changes. A short time after she was taken to hospital unresponsive, during the night the nurses heard her call and there she was sitting up on the side of her bed, she could speak clearly and had no confusion. She gave a special message to the charge nurse to be given to the Pastor, giving his full name and saying she knew he would be coming in. She said she had made a will and told exactly the name of the Lawyer and his office. She said if she died she knew her property would serve the Lord. The nurses tried to tell her she would get well and not die, but she said all was well with her either way. Shortly after this she lay down again and in a while was unresponsive again. The nurse delivered the message when Pastor came in. Much happened in relation to this as the Lord seemed to open doors every time when things seemed to us impossible. We learned the Lawyer was an Adventist and considered the best in the country. One of our Mission Sisters who works for a large auto company knew him well. We thank the Lord for how he actually fought to be able to carry out the directions of her will and retrieve looted property, from both families who, although they had not helped her at all, had come like vultures, both after her husband died and even during the funeral of Sister Molly, stealing away all they could get.

Bus Trouble Victory !

We told you about the bus accidents involving our pastors. Indeed transportation has been such a challenge for the Mission, both for means and also the time wasted in travel to reach our two mission stations and groups all over the nation! In the will, two cars had been left to Pastor, but both had been stolen, even though the thieves could not drive. The Lawyer managed to recover one, the other was not found. The recovered car was in bad need of extensive repair to be usable, there was no means to do it, and so much else needed. I told Pastor we had to forget about it for now and let it stay in the Lawyer's warehouse. And yet we all knew how much it was needed. Then a few days ago I simply said to the Lord, 'I give the car to You. You deal with it, we can't.' In less than a minute an email reached me from our Sister there making an offer to take the car to the company she was a manager at and asses and repair it to perfect shape, all we needed to do was buy the parts. Well it was done and yesterday the Pastor drove it home. It is perfect for the mission needs as it is more like a minibus and
